/01 Project: Elwood Foreshore Architect: ASPECT Studios Photographer: Andrew Lloyd

Architects' statement: The Elwood Foreshore is the focus of beach activity for the residents of the Elwood area and beyond. The redevelopment of the foreshore includes new regional cycle way, beach plaza, indigenous plantings, and a new car park with water-sensitive urban design.

The design created shared pathways and surfaces wherever possible, and introduced a continuous, safe bicycle path. The roadway and car parking systems were rationalised to minimise conflict between bicycles, pedestrians and motor vehicles. The project has also provided clear demarcated areas for large events and club use.

/02 Project: Coal Point

Architects: liquidARCHITECTURE **Photographer:** Glyn Thomas

Architects' statement: This project is a transformation of a typical red brick house into a contemporary dwelling. With excellent solar orientation and extensive views across Lake Macquarie, the core focus of the project involved retaining and extending an existing open-plan living space to maximise the site opportunities. This was achieved in the two 'loggia' that straddle the central living space and create the dominant aesthetic of the building. Special metal finished panels and painted lime green sheet cladding are used on the loggia elements while the painted brickwork becomes an abstract, flowing connector of the materials and forms with the physical realities of the site.
